
### **The AFAM Education System**



3 – Italian higher education



### Italy has a reputation for offering a high standard of education that does not involve high tuition fees or living costs.

Standard fees depend on the programme you apply for, ranging from a minimum of around 900 euros to a maximum of 4,000 euros per year at a public higher education institution, while private universities will be more expensive.

Tuition fees at Italian universities are generally **more affordable than in other parts of Western Europe or North America.** 

About cost of living, students need approximately 8,000 euros per year to cover accommodation, food, transport, leisure and other expenses. When budgeting, once you have chosen a city to move to, you need to consider your lifestyle and spending habits.





# Students during their stay in Italy

*Travelling and discovering* the country and the Schengen countries

The right to convert the residence permit into a **residence permit for job-seeking purposes**, which is valid for a maximum of 12 months.

With a study visa it is possible **to work part-time** during your stay.

### Internships

- There are **two** main kinds of curricular internships
- Compulsory curricular internship

### Non-compulsory curricular internship: non-mandatory

Generally speaking, a curricular internship isn't an actual job, which means that you might not be paid for your work.

The internships are aimed at students across majors, including those in master's or doctorate programs and specialized schools.

The objective is to pair learning with on-the-job experience. Some internships can be done to earn credit (CFUs) while others are simply about gaining valuable training and knowledge.





### For Undergraduate and Postgraduate's enrollment

## For a *single cycle* degree'senrollment

Students can ask for their CV to be assessed at all the universities to which they wish to apply. However, it is important to know that during preenrolment at Universitaly, students must choose **only one course and one university to apply to**. These are courses that usually have an entrance test. Students can apply to several universities and then put **several options** on the universitaly portal. A very concrete example: MEDICINE: The exam for foreigners is called IMAT and students can mark up to 13 universities as their preferences.
